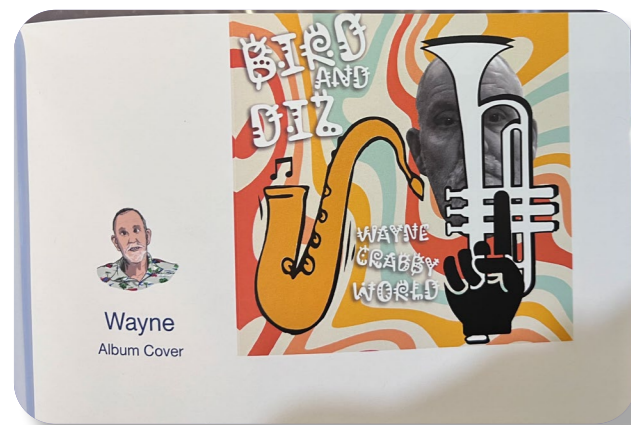

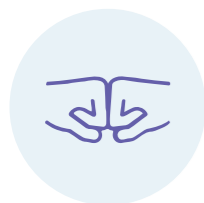
Mary has certainly left her mark on many people over her years at HomePlace, and we wish her all the very best in 'retirement' — although we are sure that Mary will be busier than ever!

Staff Awards

In addition to the participants we support, our staff are central to everything we do at HomePlace. We would like to recognise staff who consistently work at an incredibly high standard. We are pleased to announce that at HomePlace's Annual General Meeting on 20th October 2023, we will be presenting five staff awards.

We need your input to be able to do this.

We aim to present four **HomePlace Values awards**. These will be awarded to any HomePlace staff member, from support worker to a member 'working behind-the-scenes' at the HomePlace office, who consistently displays one (or more) of the HomePlace values in their work. The four awards are:



Regard for the unique identity of the individual.

Respect



Being honest and reliable.

Trust



Protection against abuse, violence, neglect and exploitation.

Safety



Achieving outcomes by working together.

Partnership

A fifth award – **the HomePlace Way award** – is the most prestigious award and will be awarded to a member of the Support services' staff team. It is awarded to an individual who demonstrates exceptional support in the HomePlace Way. That is, support which:

- ✓ Is 'participant-first' focused.
- ✓ Is provided with kindness, and a genuine sense of caring.
- ✓ Is dedicated to enabling participants to lead a life that they feel is right for them.
- ✓ Reflects HomePlace values of respect, trust, safety, partnership and building great relationships with participants, supporting them to connect to and belong within their communities.
- ✓ Shows a strong commitment to continuous improvement – support that is always striving to take the standard of support 'to the next level'.
- ✓ Aims to create or strengthen roles that people with disability can undertake, contributing to our society.

You are invited to nominate one or more staff members for one of the awards mentioned above.

You need to tell us why you think they should win the award and give us examples of what they have done that shows that they deserve to win it from your perspective.

We will be sending you a link to complete a nomination form shortly.

HomePlace Listens and Citizenhood Project 2023

We are always trying to make HomePlace better. A few months ago, we submitted a grant application to the JFA MS McLeod Foundation to help us undertake our next HomePlace Listens project. This time, as well as finding out from the people we support, families, staff and stakeholders about what we are doing well, where we need to improve and ideas for improvement, the team from Purple Orange and OurVoice SA are going to be asking questions like:

1 How do HomePlace staff help participants to build friendships and connections in community?

2 Are participants the leaders in decisions about how they live their lives, and how do their HomePlace staff help them do this?

3 What roles do participants have in their lives, and how has HomePlace helped them to expand their roles – and in particular, do these roles, help them to actively belong in their community?

We have called the project, 'HomePlace Listens and Citizenhood Project'. We are grateful to the JFA MS McLeod foundation for their financial support for this work.

We will be contacting participants, families, staff and stakeholders in the coming months with details about how you can contribute.

PACE

What is it and what does it mean for you?

What is it?

PACE is a new computer system that the NDIS is putting in across Australia.

Why?

To make it easier for participants to manage their NDIS plan budget, check how much NDIS money is left in their plan, and to approve payments for supports. It is supposed to make it easier for providers too – once a participant has endorsed the provider on the PACE system.

When?

For each participant who has a plan review from September 2023 onwards.

More information?

We are waiting on more information from the NDIS. We will share with you once we have received it.
